



## Pattern for Squirrel Made with Epoxy Clay



I used epoxy clay for my squirrel so it would be safe to leave it outside. You find several different brands of epoxy clay online. The one I used for this squirrel was [Free Form Sculpt](#). Their ‘trial size’ will give you plenty of material to make your sculpture. You could use Magic Sculpt or Apoxie Sculpt instead. They’re different brands, but they work the same way.

If you want to keep your squirrel inside, you could use either my home-made paper mache clay or air dry clay recipe for this sculpture. You can find all my recipes on the [Art Library](#) on my site.

**Green** - body

**Blue** - legs

**Turquoise** - wire for tail and hind legs

Eyes and ears are marked for placement on finished armature
